Complex safeguarding risk, Self Harm and Suicide

- 1996 seminal year published "Who's Hurting Who" – Helen Spandler – ensuring young people's voices were heard, challenged assumption around responses
- National Work around Self Harm 1996-2001, national conferences 1999 and 2000
- Online services pioneered in Salford 2017
- Integrated Community Response Service, Parachute also pioneering developments in Salford
