


- Played a strategic role in the development of the Salford Social Value partnership
- Registered as an accredited Living Wage Employer
- Became the first CVS in the country to sign up to the Dementia Action Alliance
- Signed up to the city's Armed Forces Community Covenant
- Developed the Salford 4 Good partnership alongside partners The Broughton Trust, Seedley & Langworthy Trust, Salford Disability Forum, Binoh of Manchester and the Interlink Foundation
- Established the Salford Charities pop up Shop in Eccles
- Provided Salford Third Sector Consortium with Hub management and administration support, helping the Consortium to both consolidate and grow







2013/14 continued to be a challenging year for the voluntary, community and social enterprise sector; and I'm proud that Salford CVS has developed a number of initiatives to support the sector. We launched Salford 4 Good - a new partnership project that aims to secure money and other resources for local good causes. We were proud to collaborate across Greater Manchester on our State of the Voluntary Sector 2013 report, producing both a Salford and wider Greater Manchester analysis of the sector post-austerity. These two great pieces of work helped us design our future response to the sector which we set out in our five-year Strategic Plan - feel free to download a copy from our website. We've recently developed a strong relationship with our CCG and are very pleased to be distributing much-needed funding on their behalf to many voluntary and community groups - the impact of this work is making a real difference to Salford residents.
